
### What is EPR?

- Extended producer responsibility (EPR) is a policy approach in which producers (the businesses that supply packaging and paper to residents) are operationally and financially responsible for the end-of-life management of the materials they supply to consumers.
- Many jurisdictions across Canada are moving to this framework.
- Circular Materials supports producers in meeting their obligations under each jurisdiction's EPR regulation.



### **EPR Growing Across Canada**

- EPR is gaining momentum in provinces and territories across Canada. Regulations are set provincially and territorially.
- The first full EPR program for packaging and paper in Canada was introduced in British Columbia in 2014.
- Provinces are transitioning their existing recycling programs to EPR, and other jurisdictions are just beginning to implement EPR.





# **EPR for PPP in Nova Scotia**

- The new extended producer responsibility (EPR) for packaging, paper products and packaging-like products (PPP) regulations sets out industry responsibilities for the operational and financial management of certain recyclable materials.
- EPR is recognized as one of the most effective mechanisms to improve recycling rates and advance a circular economy.
- In Nova Scotia, EPR includes servicing schools at no cost.



# **Recycling Collection Services**

- Through our service providers, Circular Materials will offer the following recycling services:
  - Collection of paper and packaging materials.
  - Appropriate outdoor collection receptacles for both container and fibre streams.
  - Providing promotional and educational materials to influence behaviour.



# Registry to Onboard Schools

- **Schools**: Public, private, band-operated, and alternative learning centers are eligible.
- We implemented an online registry on March 1, 2025 to onboard schools to determine service requirements, procure resources, and deliver recycling services effectively.
- Schools will need to register by October 31, 2025, to receive services by May 1, 2026.
- The registry will remain open to enable registration at any time. Future service cadences are to be determined.


# Registry Communications Toolkit

  - One-page overview about timeline and registry.
  - Pre-written social media posts with corresponding photos and hashtags.
  - Poster to be distributed digitally and online.
- We encourage you to share elements of the toolkits in your community.
- We are open to collaborating on a joint communications.



# Next Steps After Registering

- After registration, Circular Materials will use the information to procure recycling collection services.
- The recycling collector will:
  - Contact the assigned contact (e.g., for school district or individual school) to discuss next steps and may schedule a site visit, starting in February 2026.
  - Coordinate service and communicate service details including delivering receptacles.
  - Deliver promotion and education (P&E) packages.
