Expansion Plans

Implementing:


- Ontario: Transition from July 2023 December 2025.
- New Brunswick: Submitting draft Plan in October 2022.
- Manitoba: Providing services starting in 2023 and will support MMSM's transition to EPR.

Participating:

- Saskatchewan: Consulting.
- Newfoundland and Labrador: Consulting.
- Alberta: Represent producers in implementing EPR program once Regulation is finalized.

Monitoring:

- Nova Scotia: Awaiting Regulation.
- Yukon: Awaiting Regulation.
- Prince Edward Island: Monitoring activity.





Regulatory Context



Regulatory Requirements for Producers

- In October 2021, the Government of New Brunswick amended the <u>Designated Materials Regulation</u> under the <u>Clean Environment Act</u> to establish an Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) program for packaging and paper in the province.
- Section 50.56 of the Regulation allows brand owners to designate an Agent to carry out their obligations within the Regulation.
- Circular Materials is acting as an Agent for brand owners in New Brunswick.
 - On behalf of its brand owners, Circular Materials consulted on and will submit a New Brunswick Stewardship Plan for Packaging and Paper to comply with section 50.55 of the Regulation.



Regulatory Requirements for a Stewardship Plan

- Producers or an Agent working on behalf of producers, must develop a Stewardship Plan that includes:
 - A plan for the collection, transportation, storage, reuse and recycling of packaging and paper waste.
 - Estimated quantity of packaging and paper distributed and collected;
 - Collection services for single-unit, multi-unit, schools and other non-IC&I spaces;
 - A plan for expansion of services;
 - The plan for the management of packaging and paper waste, by material type;
 - A description of the material types that will be used for performance measures and targets and annual reporting purposes; and
 - A consultation report with a summary of the feedback received and how stakeholder interests were taken into consideration.



Proposed Changes to the Stewardship Plan



Stewardship Plan Consultation

- On May 2, 2022, Circular Materials
 Atlantic posted and began a three month consultation process on its
 draft New Brunswick Stewardship
 Plan for Packaging and Paper.
- Municipalities, service providers and producers were invited to participate and share their feedback through several communication channels including stakeholder-specific webinars, one-onone meetings, and email communications

Consultation: New Brunswick Stewardship Plan for Packaging and Paper

Circular Materials Atlantic has developed a New Brunswick Stewardship Plan for Packaging and Paper on behalf of producers obligated by the Designated Materials Regulation under the *Clean Environment Act*

To ensure the Stewardship Plan represents the interests of our stakeholders, we will be engaging producers, municipal representatives and service providers in a comprehensive and meaningful three-month consultation process, which is outlined in more detail below.

We encourage stakeholders to participate in our consultations and provide written feedback to help us finalize the Stewardship Plan prior to submitting to Recycle New Brunswick for approval in October 2022.

Stewardship Plan Consultation



- To support stakeholders in providing meaningful feedback, the consultation deadline was extended to August 5, 2022.
- We received 23 written feedback submissions which will be summarized within the consultation report.

Key Dates in Consultation Process

MATERIALS	
Date	Milestone
Late 2021 until early 2022	Collection of baseline data and information required to develop the draft Stewardship Plan.
May 2, 2022	Draft Stewardship Plan distributed to stakeholders; consultation process began.
May 18, 2022	Producer-focused webinar on draft Stewardship Plan.
June 7, 2022	Municipal-focused webinar on draft Stewardship Plan.
June 8, 2022	Service provider-focused webinar on draft Stewardship Plan.
August 5, 2022	Extended Deadline for feedback on Stewardship Plan.
TODAY: September 12, 2022	Additional consultation webinar to review proposed revisions to the Stewardship Plan based on feedback received.
Prior to October 14	Circular Materials finalizes the Stewardship Plan.
October 14, 2022	Stewardship Plan submitted to Recycle NB for approval.
Six months following plan approval (TBC by Recycle NB)	Transition to EPR begins.



General Stewardship Plan Revisions

- The Stewardship Plan was revised to address only the requirements of the Regulation outlined earlier in this presentation.
 - Excerpts of Regulatory requirements were added at the beginning of each section of the Stewardship Plan.
 - Background information and context for the development of the Stewardship Plan were removed, as this information is not required by the Regulation.
 - Baseline data were limited to estimated supply to market and collected quantities, as required by the Regulation.



Designated Materials

Feedback Received:

 Stakeholders requested clarification on the materials that will be eligible for collection.

- The Stewardship Plan defines printed and unprinted paper, as well as primary packaging, convenience packaging and transport packaging that is provided with a product consistent with the Regulation.
- All packaging and paper designated in the Regulation and defined in the Stewardship Plan will be collected when processing facilities are capable of receiving these materials.
- Clarification was added to the revised Stewardship Plan regarding the collection of designated packaging and paper and the circumstances leading to a standardized list of accepted materials across the province.



Collection Services

Feedback Received:

Questions were raised about collection activities during plan implementation.

- Clarification was added to the Stewardship Plan on the proposed approach to contracting municipalities and other service providers.
- Collection from dwellings and schools will be delivered by Circular Materials Atlantic through either:
 - An offer by Circular Materials Atlantic to, and acceptance of the offer by, an RSC, municipality or First Nation resulting in a contract between the parties; or
 - Circular Materials Atlantic awarding a contract to a private company through direct negotiations or an RFP process.



Compensation for Collection Services

Feedback Received:

Questions were raised about compensation for collection services.

- Circular Materials will compile cost information from RSCs, municipalities and First Nations currently providing collection services.
 - A third-party accountant will be retained to ensure information is consistent and complete including capital costs.
- Using this information, Circular Materials will develop a compensation offer to RSCs, municipalities and First Nations for collection services.
- RSCs, municipalities and First Nations can accept or decline the offer.
- Compensation will be paid for services provided to Circular Materials Atlantic when the services are provided.




Transition Approach and Timing

Feedback Received:

- From municipalities:
 - Concerns were raised about the extended length and three-phase approach to transition.
 - It was suggested that Circular Materials shorten the time for transition and reduce the number of phases.
- From private sector service providers:
 - Concerns were raised about the compressed timeline for transition.
 - It was suggested that Circular Materials lengthen the time for each phase.




Activities that can be Undertaken During Plan Review

Transition Approach and Timing

How Feedback was Reflected in the Stewardship Plan:

- The revised Stewardship Plan shortens the transition to two phases over twelve months rather than three phases over eighteen months.
- Phases continue to be based on groups of RSCs to ensure a regional approach to transition with contiguous geographies on a similar timeline.

To transition in two phases over twelve months:

- We will ask municipalities, First Nations and RSCs to compress the timelines for their activities described in previous slides.
- In each of the two phases, we will first transition services where municipalities, First Nations and RSCs accept Circular Materials' offer to deliver collection services.
- Then, within six months, we will transition services where the municipality, First Nations or RSC declines to provide collection services. This additional six months provides time for Circular Materials to issue an RFP to select a collection partner.



Program Expansion

Feedback Received:

• Stakeholders questioned the sequencing of service expansion.

- Additional details were added to the Stewardship Plan to clarify the schedule for expanding services:
 - Within six months after existing curbside and depot services are transitioned, curbside collection services for packaging and paper will be provided to dwellings receiving curbside garbage collection.
 - Within a further 12 months, public space collection services will be provided.



Communication to Residents

Feedback Received:

• Stakeholders requested information on the approach to promotion and education (P&E).

How Feedback was Reflected in the Stewardship Plan:

- Clarification was added to the Stewardship Plan:
 - Where Circular Materials Atlantic contracts with municipalities to provide collection services, customer service and local P&E will be included in the contracted services and continue to be provided by municipalities.
 - Where Circular Materials Atlantic contracts with private companies to provide collection services, customer service will be provided by the contractor and Circular Materials Atlantic will provide local P&E.


