## **NEW** as of **JULY 1, 2023: Blue Box Transition!**

**Starting July 1st:** Please direct all recycling inquiries to GFL. For new or replacement Blue Boxes, please call 1.888.941.3345 ext.1 to make arrangements.

As of **July 1, 2023**, Dufferin County's recycling program will be managed by Circular Materials, a not-for-profit producer responsibility organization committed to building efficient and effective recycling systems to minimize waste and ensure materials are reused again and again. This transition will result in no change to the materials you can recycle or your collection calendar.

#### **Curbside Battery Collection**

To coincide with Daylight Savings! Place battery bag ON TOP of your Green Bin or BESIDE your garbage on your regular collection day during this week.

One week of Christmas Tree collection in the Week A & Rural areas. One week of Christmas Tree collection in the Week B area.

## **Hazardous & Electronic Waste Events**

Drop off Hazardous & Electronic waste for recycling and proper disposal.

#### 2023 Dates COMING SOON.

Hazardous & Electronic Waste events usually occur between the Spring and Fall in various locations in Dufferin County. We're currently working on dates, times and locations for 2023 events.

#### **RECYCLING MATERIALS BLOWING OUT OF YOUR BLUE BOX?**

Stack your Blue Boxes and place heavier items on top to prevent materials from blowing out.



#### **MOVING? CLEANING OUT THE GARAGE?**

Bulky items are collected on your regular collection day on the last week of the month. It is \$25 for up to 4 items. Arrange a pick up at least one week in advance by calling GFL (credit card only) at

WHITE GOODS Fee: \$20 each (\*plus \$10 to remove refrigerants)

#### **Accepted Items:**

Air Conditioners\* Dishwashers Solid metal desks Barbecues (excluding Freezers\* Stoves propane tanks) Humidifiers Washers & dryers Bathtubs Hot water tanks Water coolers\* Dehumidifiers\* Refrigerators\*

For safety reasons, please ensure that appliances are empty, remove doors and lids, and place them beside the item.

### Options to line the bin

Placing compostable materials loose in the Green Bin, with **no liner** at all, is acceptable. Keep in mind that food may freeze to the bottom and the container will need to be rinsed out more often.

Wrapping compostable materials in **newspaper or paper bags** will absorb moisture, reduce odours and pests, and prevent materials from freezing to the bottom of the Green Bin in the winter.

Using certified compostable bags in the Green Bin or kitchen collector will minimize odours, insects and leakage. The bags must have either logo (shown here) to be accepted.



COMPOSTABLE

Plastic bags (clear green plastic bags, shopping bags, garbage bags, etc.) are **not permitted** and will not be collected. However, another option is to duct tape a plastic bag into the Green Bin, so that it does not come out of the bin when the contents are collected.

## Rinse before you recycle!

Food residue, such as liquid from containers contaminate other products like newspaper and make them unrecyclable. Please remember to rinse all containers, bottles, cans and jars before placing them in your Blue Box to help avoid contamination!

## vard waste

Refer to the calendar for yard waste collection dates. Collection of yard waste begins on the Monday of designated weeks and continues until the entire collection area is completed, which may take a few days.

Place yard waste at the curb by Monday at 7 am of your scheduled week to ensure collection.


### **Acceptable materials** Set out requirements

## **Close the Loop on Organics!**







Paper towel, napkins and tissues are items that belong in the Green Bin.


These items break down easily when wet, they are made out of a grade of paper that is meant to be single use, and cannot be recycled into new paper products. Place these items in the Green Bin, which will help avoid Blue Box contamination, and keep organic material out of landfill. Items placed in the Green Bin are taken to a composting facility where they are processed into compost that nourishes plants and flowers in your garden!



Unavoidable food waste? Put it in the Green Bin! Create compost. Close the loop.

### batteries

Recycle your single-use alkaline & rechargeable batteries!



Visit dufferincounty.ca/waste for a list of Drop Off Locations throughout the County.

#### Bring batteries to a **Dufferin Hazardous & Electronic Waste Event**.

Watch for curbside collections, which typically occur twice a year. Battery bags will be mailed to each household ahead of the collection. Bags are also available for pick up at any local municipal office.

NO loose batteries in the Green Bin, Garbage or Blue Box.

## azardous & electronic waste events

Hazardous and electronic wastes are not collected curbside, but instead can be brought to any **Hazardous** and Electronic Waste Event. These events happen at various locations throughout Dufferin between Spring and Fall. Check the website for dates and locations.



#### **LIMITATIONS:**

No waste from industrial, commercial, or institutional sources. Household waste only.

No garbage or recycling.

**No white goods/large appliances,** such as refrigerators, washers and dryers, air conditioners, or dehumidifiers, including anything with freon/refrigerant.

#### Unidentified/unknown materials will not be accepted.

Drums of material will not be accepted. Please safely place materials into smaller containers, if required.

Liquid containers must not exceed 20L (5.25 gal.). Propane tanks must not exceed 13.6kg (30lbs).

#### **ACCEPTED HAZARDOUS WASTES**

**Automotive containers, fluids, & batteries** Antifreeze, gasoline & other fuels, used motor oil & filters, automotive batteries, empty containers of automotive fluids.

#### **Household chemicals & cleaning products** Aerosols, bleach, paints, pool chemicals, rat poison, solvents, cleaners.

Compact fluorescent (CFL) bulbs, fluorescent tubes, batteries (all types), lighters and lighter fluid, propane cylinders, thermostats containing mercury, nail polish &

#### remover, cooking oil. Lawn & garden products

Other household items

Fertilizer, pesticides & herbicides.

#### **Health products**

Pharmaceuticals, expired medications, vitamins, sharps & syringes (in a rigid & sealed container).

#### All materials should be left in the original container or labeled to allow easy identification of the contents. Please tightly cap all containers.

If you are not sure about a particular item, please contact Dufferin Waste.

#### **ACCEPTED ELECTRONIC WASTES**

#### **Audio equipment**

Radios & audio players (CD/DVD/Cassette/mp3/iPod), recorders, turntables, speakers, equalizers, amplifiers.

#### **Cameras and camcorders (all types)** Digital, web & analog cameras, lenses, flashes,

#### **Computers and computer parts** Laptops, tablets, monitors, printers, scanners, and

peripherals (e.g. modems, mice).

#### **Electrical household items**

Christmas lights, lamps, fans, alarm clocks, digital frames, typewriters, hair dryers, straighteners, electric toothbrushes.

#### **Electric tools**

Power tools, electric hedge trimmers, electric leaf

blowers, electric lawn mowers, vacuums.


### Home entertainment equipment

Televisions (all types), receivers, video game consoles & cartridges, video projectors, speakers, VHS/DVD players & recorders.

#### **Phones and communication devices**

Cell phones, smart phones, pagers, telephones, answering machines.

Small appliances Microwaves, toasters, coffee machines, blenders, coffee grinders, shredders.
