Accepted materials

Sort your materials: put containers (metal and plastics) in one bin and paper/cardboard in another bin.





Cardboard: Cereal boxes, egg cartons, corrugated cardboard, paper towel rolls.

Papers: Envelopes, newspaper.



Metal: Food and beverage cans, aluminum foil, aluminum pie pans.

Plastic: Containers, bottles, cans.

There is no change to the materials you currently recycle.

Recycling tips:

- Sort recyclable materials from garbage and organics.
- Flatten and bundle cardboard.
- Empty and give containers a quick rinse.
- Keep materials loose.

Starting May 1, 2024, recycling collection will take place during the day instead of overnight, and your collection day will likely shift. Check the back of this guide for your collection day.
